Plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement.

The NAAC peer team visited our College on July 1st, 2nd and 3rd, 2003. Since our College is a Government College, Principal – the Chairperson of the IQAC was transferred often and it took time for the settlement of new Chairperson and Senior Staff members. So IQAC could not be formed in time. Anyhow the regular activities of the College are in progress. They are as follows.

- Faculty members of various Departments attended Seminars, Orientation programmes and Refresher courses. Research activities were effectively carried out. Steps were taken for the improvement of infrastructure facilities.
- Remedial classes conducted for the weak students.
- In the Tutorial System, Staff members (Counsellors) periodically interact with their wards every week at a specified time to give counselling and to sort-out their problems. Many students utilise this opportunity to solve their personal as well as academic problems. Tutorial system effectively functioned.
- Career Counselling Cell of our Institute provided valuable guidance to the students for Higher studies, to get financial support from Banks etc., and to get good employment from various reputed companies.
- Community services were very actively carried out.
- Computer knowledge was given to students through Computer Literacy Programme.
- A Student's Grievance Cell is functioning to solve student's problems providing opportunities to record their grievances in a democratic manner.

In the year 2003-2004 we have admitted 1323 number of students from rural area, 331 from urban area.

Student's from remote villages are given, hostel accommodation at a very low cost. Students from weaker sections and from distant rural places are helped to get free accommodation in Government BC & SC Hostels.
