1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

Our College was established with the aim of providing quality education to girl students of under privileged from educationally backward areas in Tirunelveli District. The College has been playing its role for attracting girl students from traditional family background in which girls are denied higher education. In spite of many difficulties, such as inadequate number of faculty members, employees, shortage of space, fund crunches and frequent change of Head of the Institution, our College has broken all these bottle necks to attain its vision. In our Institution a sizable and weaker and minority sections of students from the rural backgrounds are admitted every year, so our Faculty members are trying their best to spread the light of education to these sections of the social advancement to achieve the mission of the Institution

To accommodate more rural girl students in the hostel, efforts were taken to increase the strength of the hostel at a very low fee structure. As there is a considerable increase in the strength of the College, efforts were taken to provide Government Transport facilities with concession (bus pass) in the fare. To fulfill our mission to give quality education to girl

students from rural - areas for higher education low fees structure, vernacular medium of teaching, bus pass for economic transportation, low cost hostel facility and establishment of Government free hostels near our Institution have been provided. This has changed the educational scenario in the vicinity.
